From the Pastor's Desk...

"It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah." Matthew 2:26

One of the strange birth stories of Jesus is with the man named Simeon. He doesn't get much press time, only 10 verses. We are told he was a righteous and devout man, full of the Holy Spirit, and looking for the coming Messiah. Simeon has the gift of prophecy. Mary and Joseph traveled to the Jerusalem Temple, which was only 6 miles from Bethlehem. There Mary follows the purification rights for women and then the consecration rites for first born males.

Simeon enters and recognizes Jesus as the Messiah. He takes Jesus in his arms and exalts God, gives a prophecy, and blesses the family. I imagine the parents of Jesus were probably feeling a little anxious. Who is this strange man holding our child and saying these bizarre words? Perhaps they weren't so surprised given the strange events they had already experienced.

But Simeon intrigues me. Imagine waiting - day after day, year after year, hoping, watching, listening, praying, and then suddenly the Messiah appears. What joy he must have felt. The answer to all his prayers and the promise of God to him is fulfilled. He goes home to rest in peace.

Simeon was patiently looking forward to the consolation of Israel. What are we looking forward to during this Advent Season? Getting together with family, parties with friends, a certain gift, Christmas decorations, special music, a candlelight service, all good things mind you, hey I like a cup of eggnog too, but these things do not really capture Advent as much as we might want them to. They are rather trivial compared to Simeon's hope and devotion.

What are we desperately praying for, waiting for, and longing for that we are willing to watch and wait, perhaps for years? In our fast pace, quick result, hurry up and get it done, instant gratification world, my suspicion is not much. It takes great faith to watch for and seek the Messiah in our midst, but that is precisely what Advent is all about.

The word 'advent' literally means 'coming' or 'arrival' and it is a time of reflection on what the coming of Christ means to the world. It is also a time of looking for Christ in the world right now and forward to when he will come again.

Is our deepest desire for the Messiah to arrive, the Messiah who is, not necessarily the one we imagine? Is Advent more than checking things off our list? What are we looking forward to, the one who frees the oppressed, the one who brings good news to the poor, who sets the captives free, who heals the blind and the lame? Advent is coming, what are we watching for?

### Community Worship Service December 29<sup>th</sup> at 11am


### St. Paul's Lutheran Church 401 Church Street

#### **Due December 8th**



As Music Director at First Presbyterian, it is with great joy and enthusiasm that I introduce to you, our church family, our new soprano and tenor section leaders. They are here to provide support for the chancel choir and to help continue building the music program at First Presbyterian. Please take a moment to read their biographies below to learn more about them!



Stephen Faubel began taking piano lessons and singing in church talent shows at age 4. He launched his musical career at age 10, singing with the St. Thomas Choir in NYC where he recorded with Judy Collins and performed with Jessve Norman, the Concert Royal and toured Italy, Austria and New England. In high school, Stephen studied piano at Marywood University and sang 1st chair at All-State Chorus in 1998 and 1999 and performed at Carnegie Hall for All Eastern Chorus. He continued his studies in piano and voice at Penn State with Dr. Norman Spivey and Dr. Steven Smith, eventually earning a BA in Music. During this time, Stephen toured Eastern Europe and the southern US with Dr. Anthony Leach's "Essence of Joy." In 2008-2009, he sung with The New York Choral Society at Carnegie Hall and with the Robert Dale/Arcadia Chorale in Scranton from 2010-2020. Stephen has held positions as Music Director/Accompanist at Bethany Presbyterian Church and Accompanist at Hawley United Methodist Church. Since 2009, Stephen has been involved with the Ritz Company Playhouse in Hawley, PA as the Music Director and/or accompanist and currently serves on the Board of Directors. Stephen has taught private music lessons for over 20 years. He is currently an instructor at Black Bear Conservatory of Music in Hawley and serves as the President of the Board of Directors. Stephen plays in a wide range of ensembles throughout Hawley and Northeast Pennsylvania, ranging from classical, jazz, rock, jam, reggae, folk and original music.



Lauren Piccotti was born and raised in Flemington, New Jersey. Her love of music began in Elementary school and progressed through Middle and High School as she became actively involved in multiple choirs including Regional and All-State choir, select ensembles, musicals, and color guard in the marching band. Lauren attended Marywood University in Scranton, receiving her B.A. in Music Administration, with a focus in Music and Business. She networked with a wide audience of musicians in college, where she was a member of the Marywood Chamber Singers as well as the Marywood Campus Choir. During her senior year, she became a member of the Robert Dale Chorale which transitioned to Arcadia Chorale and is still a member today. Along with Chorale, Lauren was a part of the inception of Voce Angeli, a women's choir based in Scranton and continues to sing with them in the summer. Lauren is also a vocal coach. She taught at the Scranton Music Academy in Scranton, PA for 12 years until she and her husband built their home and moved locally to Newfoundland. She teaches voice lessons out of her home. Until recently, Lauren sang as the Soprano in the quartet at St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Scranton for 17 years. She is honored to join as the Soprano section leader here at First Presbyterian Church of Hawley!

### Fall Bible Studies Advent Bible Study

Our Bible Study groups will shift to an Advent Bible Study on **November 20<sup>th</sup>**. We will focus on the Gospel Mark and the Advent this writer proclaims. Interestingly, Mark does not write anything about the Birth Narrative as the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. However, the kingdom messages of Jesus greatly proclaim the new world Christ has brought into being. We will be using the book "Holy Disruption: Discovering Advent in the Gospel of Mark" by Tracy Daub. Holy Disruption presents a fresh understanding of the holiness of Christmas grounded, not in a conventional cozy Christmas message, but through Mark's disquieting gospel which invites its readers to experience God's disruptive but transformative love for us and our world.
